



## Helena's Story-

hen I joined LIFT Church in my first year, I had plenty of exposure to the concept of "sending". Now I am witnessing my disciples go through the same phases of initial hesitation to pursue Jesus' call to make disciples, I realize that my own pursuit of success as the world defines it will never be as fulfilling in comparison to giving all that I can to see Christ build His church."
